Stewart began scuba diving in 1988 at East Carolina University. He graduated in 1992 with a BS in Business Management. Stewart became a NAUI Scuba Instructor in 1992 and taught open waters at ECU for a year. Next he went to Grand Cayman and managed a small dive shop called the "Dive Inn". He spent the next three years in Grand Cayman learning the business and working on his sea time. Then he acquired his 100 ton Captain's license and headed West to the Pacific. Landing in Truk Lagoon, Micronesia; the "Ship Wreck Capital of the World". In a few short months he was the Captain of the Truk Aggressor. He spent five years there exploring the ins & outs of World War II wrecks. During this time he ventured to Bikini Atoll in the Marshall Islands, Palau Islands & down to the Solomon Islands. He continued to work on his sea time over the years and upgraded his Captain's license to a 500 Ton Masters. The next chapter was to take a break from the islands. He returned to Raleigh for a couple years working in photography. During this time he purchased a swim club in North Raleigh and operated it during the summers. With six months tied to his business, he spent the other months back in the Tropics. In 2005 he was the relief Captain on the Odyssey in Truk Lagoon for a short stint. Then in 2006 he was offered a job in Raja Ampat, Indonesia. Now he is spending his "Winters" in Indonesia and his "summers" in Raleigh. He was very fortunate that his circumstances and his employers matched so well that he can do 6 & 6. While in Raja Ampat, he is the cruise director aboard the **Seven Seas**. She is a luxurious 30m schooner that travels different parts of Indo (Raja Ampat, Banda Islands & Komodo Islands just to mention a few). The stunning Raja Ampat (Papua) Islands offer a diving experience of a lifetime. The region boasts the richest tropical coral reef biodiversity recorded anywhere. It is the Hottest spot to dive.
